Dear Scouts, Scouters and Parents,

Attached to this letter is a snack bar ticket which has been laminated. This is a small token of appreciation of your behavior and conduct during the Washington tour and Jamboree. Thanks for being good scout representatives.

While everything is fresh on your mind, you might write down any suggestions to make Jambo 2001 a better experience for everyone. There is no need to put your name on it if you don't want to. Give us the good with the bad.

Enclosed you will find a sheet to design the 2001 patch. While all patches are fresh on your mind, you may want to put your ideas on paper. We might use one turned in now or combine it with others to come up with the "Yoda Patch" of 2001. You can return your design to any of the leaders, the scout offices, or bring it to the reunion.

Also enclosed is who is in our pictures. These have been corrected from the previous ones that some of you have received. Check and see if the names are spelled correctly and correctly identifies each scout. If everything is okay, you may want to glue it to the back of the appropriate picture so you will know who is who (if your memory is like mine).

I would like to take this opportunity to thank each scout and scouter for a job well done. Troop 1638 was singled out by the region headquarters and was selected by Subcamp 16 for two Jamboree flag ceremonies. Troop 1638 was probably the only troop at Jamboree to receive both honors. Special thanks should go to the youth leadership for an excellent job. The adults could not have asked for a better group of scouts. Last but not least, thanks should go to Ray Vaden and Jerry Tochterman. Ray did a superb job in organizing, gathering materials, getting donations and supervising building the gateway.
